**Collaborate. Innovate. Grow.**

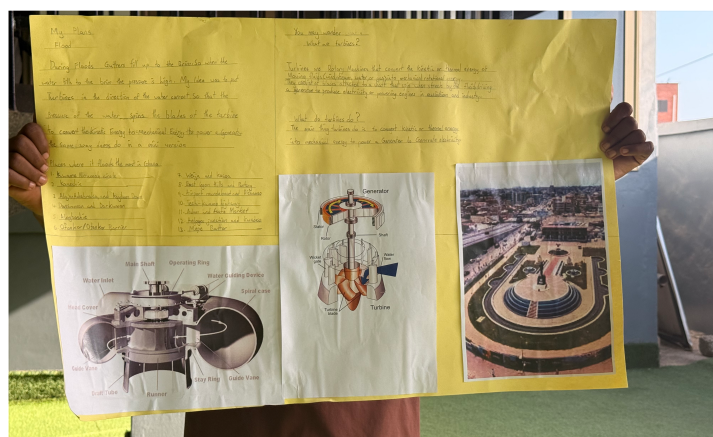
Theme for 2025/26 Academic Year
